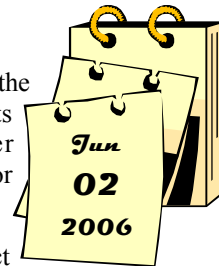

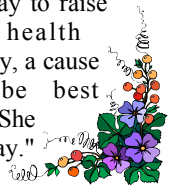

CGFM Certification For The Busy Commuter

Excuse #1 - "*I don't have time to study for the CGFM*"

Excuse #2 - "*I don't need another certification*"

These are two of the excuses I had for not wanting to be a CGFM. After taking the CPA exam 6 years ago, I did not want another six-month monster taking over all my free time. I became interested in *thinking about* taking the CGFM after talking with Sue Tefft, the Boston Chapter Membership Director, who passed the exams recently. Sue gave me some pointers and good advice but I was still concerned about the time spent studying.

When I received the box of study guides in the mail, I was still trying to fit an hour of evening studying into my schedule when I realized that the material is perfectly suited to studying during my commute to work. Unlike the CPA exam which had many lengthy problems and calculations, the CGFM is nearly all reading with a summary and questions at the end of each chapter. This was the answer to my time management problem. The study guides are in loose-leaf format so that each day I could remove 20-30 pages and take them with me on the train. Armed with only a pencil and a highlighter, I spent 25 minutes studying on the morning commute and 40 minutes on the evening commute. This took care of Excuse #1 - "*I don't have time to study for the CGFM.*" If you commute via public transportation you have built-in study time that you may not even realize.

While taking the 3 exams, I discovered how broad the material is in terms of coverage and how relevant the CGFM is to those who wish to move up in the ranks of government financial management or those who just want to improve their skills in their current jobs. The study guides are well written and easy to understand despite the tremendous variety of material that is covered. I was impressed that AGA did such an excellent job of compiling the topics that are of importance in today's government financial management arena. This took care of Excuse #2 - "*I don't need another certification.*" I may not have *needed* it but I'm glad that I have done it.

In terms of cost/benefit, the CGFM is a great deal. This is especially true when you consider that one of the benefits of being an AGA-Boston Chapter member is that you may apply for one of 5 CGFM scholarships offered each year where the chapter will reimburse you for the cost of the exams plus the application fee after you pass the exam. Your employer may even pick up the cost of the study guides. If you purchase the study guides with CPE credit, you will earn 48 CPEs. 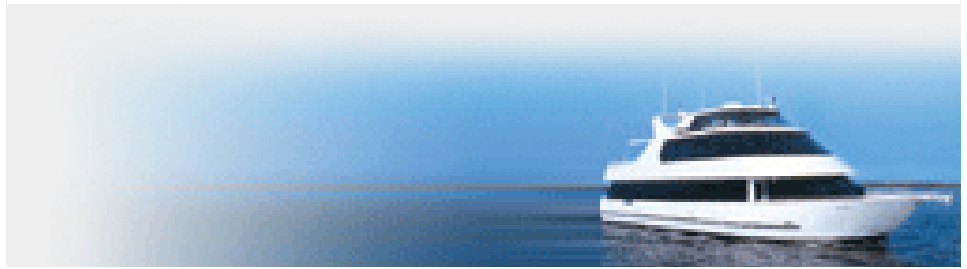
