If you have pets or young children that may be prone to eating things they shouldn't, always check to see if a plant is hazardous if ingested.



#### **CEC Meeting Highlights**

The Boston Chapter of the AGA Executive Committee met on March 3, 2009. The following items were discussed:

- Education The chapter will offer one 2010 RPDC Scholarship drawn at random to a person who completes the 2009 RPDC online evaluation.
- CGFM Governor Deval Patrick declared March as CGFM Month in Massachusetts. A couple of members have expressed interest in the CGFM scholarship. One member plans to take the exams at the National PDC in New Orleans.
