Employer Finds Way to Entice Applicant: Give 'Experience Credit' to CGFMs



It's not unusual for AGA chapter leaders to educate local employers about the value of the CGFM certification in the hope of gaining recognition for employees. What *is* unusual is the employer making the first move—in this case by offering a stipend to CGFMs to attract a potential job candidate.

That's exactly what happened to Kim Prendergast when she applied for an internal auditor position at the Roosevelt School District in south Phoenix. Prendergast, who is a CGFM, CIA, CPA and CGAP, was offered the job, but she was saddened to discover that it paid less than she was earning in her current position. The district figured out a way to offer her a comparable salary by changing the salary schedule for four positions in the district: internal auditor, director, supervisor and assistant director.

"They came up with it as a way to match the salary, which I thought was fantastic," said Prendergast, who is president-elect of AGA's Phoenix Chapter. "This really came from them, not me."

CGFMs who are hired for those four positions are now eligible for an annual stipend, or "experience credit," of \$2,500. The stipend is added to the base salary and spread over each pay period. Prendergast, who accepted the job about a year ago, said it amounts to more than \$200 a month.

"The district came up with professional stipend to make their salary more competitive," Prendergast said. "They had the CPA stipend, but that was the only one they had." The district added CGFM, CFE, CIA and CGAP to that list, and the CFO has started sitting for the CGFM Examinations.

Prendergast finds the position to be challenging and enjoyable at the same time. The district, which covers 10,500 students in 20 schools, is in an economically disadvantaged area. More than 95 percent of the students qualify for free or reduced lunches. Many students speak Spanish, and the district offers outreach programs to parents to help them learn English. "A lot of hope comes out of our district," Prendergast said.

Prendergast has been an AGA member for about 16 years and has served in many leadership positions in the chapter. She finds the CGFM opens the door to meet new people at their chapter meetings. "It's a great way to start a conversation, giving us a connection we wouldn't have had otherwise."

The Phoenix chapter has purchased the study guides and encourages its members to go through the rigorous testing process to earn the certification. Now the Roosevelt School District is recognizing its value as well.

"AGA has stressed the importance of the CGFM for years," Prendergast said. "I was so excited that an employer acknowledged it."

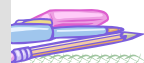

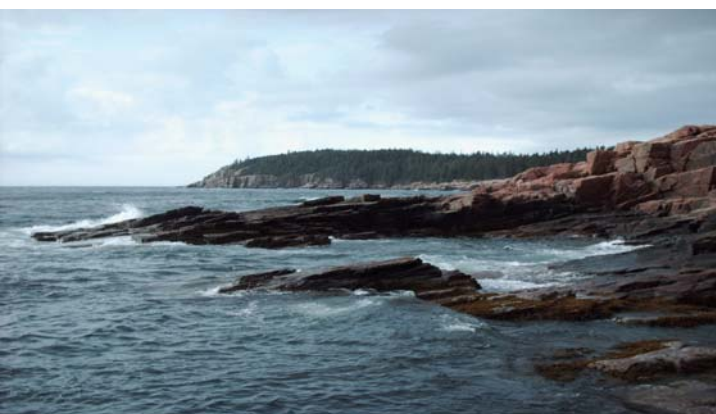

AGA's Two-Day Ethics Course Can Provide Valuable Feedback

The recent failures and frauds that have consumed organizations have a common problem--ethical lapses. Setting appropriate ethical standards, adhering to these standards and providing the correct tone throughout your organization can help prevent problems. AGA offers a course that can help in this area, "Ethics In the Workplace." This course examines the components of ethical behavior, the influence of tone at the top and doing the right thing when there is no guidance. If properly used, this course can also provide valuable feedback on your organization's ethical well-being.

For example, the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Kansas City recently held two days of "Ethics in the Workplace" training, one for staff and one for managers. During the staff training, time was set aside for staff to provide anonymous feedback on the organization's ethics. 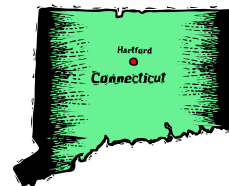

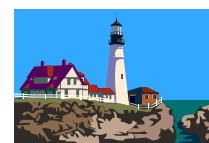

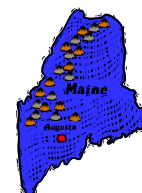
