AGA is pleased to announce its latest new audio conference on ethics. This audio conference will explore an innovative framework for recognizing ethical dilemmas, analyzing those dilemmas to focus on the heart of the problem in each situation, and resolving them using three ethical decision-making principles.

The presentation is based on the work of Rushworth Kidder, Ph.D., the founder and president of the non-profit Institute for Global Ethics. The key element of this approach is that the traditional view of ethical dilemmas is not valid by definition and not helpful in the real world. The prefix “di” means two, and the rest of the word, “lemma,” comes from the Greek concepts of assumptions or theories. Thus, the speaker will be attempting to make a distinction between situations where auditors/financial and program managers face a conflict of core, moral values (dilemmas) and situations where one of the two choices is clearly wrong.

To share his knowledge and expertise in ethical situations is **Alan Z. Goodman**, President, Goodman Professional Development, Inc.

Please join us for two hours of lively discussion about this important and timely topic. In addition to the speaker’s commentary, about 20 minutes is set aside for Q&A.

## CGFM EXAMS



Interested in the CGFM certification? Sign up for AGA's Intensive Review Course and take the CGFM Examinations before the PDC. Don't miss this opportunity to earn your CGFM.

The Intensive Review Course will take place from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. on Thursday, July 26, and Friday, July 27, 2012. The CGFM Examinations will be offered by appointment only on July 28–29, 2012.

The cost of the course is only \$315 for qualified participants, and offers 18 CPE hours. Special Bonus: The CGFM Examinations are offered at no cost to course attendees. The cost of this course is **not** included in the PDC registration fee.

BEFORE YOU REGISTER, PLEASE READ:

**What is the Intensive Review Course?** It is a special, limited enrollment opportunity for those individuals who have already been studying for the CGFM Examinations and want some extra reinforcement of the material.

An instructor reviews the main topics covered in the examinations, and can explain concepts, provide examples and answer questions for those who chose the self-study option. For those who took the AGA instructor-led courses, it is a refresher.

**What it is NOT:** It is **not** a shortcut. The Intensive Review Course is **not** a substitute for the three AGA instructor-led training courses. It is usually **not** enough by itself to prepare for the CGFM Examinations. Advance preparation is strongly recommended. It is **not** an exam prep course with strategies on how to pass the exams.

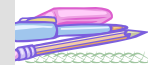

### FASAB Looking for Comments on PP&E Accounting

The Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB) is seeking input on an Exposure Draft, *Accounting for Impairment of General Property, Plant, and Equipment Remaining in Use*.

The proposed standards would require entities to report the effects of general property, plant, and equipment (G-PP&E) impairments in their financial statements when they occur rather than as a part of the ongoing depreciation expense for the G-PP&E or upon disposal of the G-PP&E.

The proposed standards also enhance comparability of financial statements between entities by requiring all entities to account for impairments in a similar manner. The exposure draft requests written comments by **May 28, 2012**, and encourages respondents to provide the reasons for their positions.

### FAF Seeking Reviewers for GASB Standards

The Financial Accounting Foundation (FAF), the oversight body of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB), is seeking interested stakeholders to participate in post-implementation review (PIR) surveys of GASB standards for state and local governments. These surveys will help the FAF evaluate the effectiveness of accounting standards by hearing from those who are affected by them.

Stakeholders who would like the opportunity to participate in PIR surveys conducted by an independent survey firm on behalf of the Financial Accounting Foundation should [register online](#). The PIR process is designed to be independent of GASB's standard-setting process.

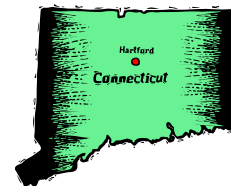

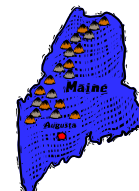


Chapter CEC Meetings are scheduled for the 2nd Thursday of each month. General Membership Meetings are held as needed.
